CITY COUNCIL ACTION ROUNDUP: April 23 and May 14, 2024 City Council Meetings

April 23 Council Meeting

- Authorized the City Manager to sign an indemnification agreement and allow for use of the county facility located at 453 East County Road 49 1/2, Willows CA, for Emergency Vehicle Operations Course training.
- Adopted a resolution declaring weeds, rubbish, refuse, and dirt public nuisances; and approved the Weed and Rubbish Abatement Schedule for the 2024 fire season.
- Authorized the City Manager to execute a Power Purchase Agreement with RP Willows Solar 1, LLC to install ground mount solar panels at the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- Established a Financial Sustainability Advisory Committee and directed staff to invite civic groups and church members to participate.

May 14 Council Meeting

- Authorized the City Manager to update the Finance Director Classification and Salary Schedule.
- Adopted a resolution of intention to levy and collect assessments; and set the time and date of the required public protest hearing for the City of Willows Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District.
- Awarded contract for weed abatement services to Robert Burt Construction.

Engineering Division

Annual Pavement and Construction Project Construction has started on the replacement of non-conforming pedestrian ramps and sidewalks on the following street segments:

- North Humboldt Street between Wood and Sycamore Streets,
- Sycamore Street between North Humboldt Street and Villa Avenue, and
- Crawford Avenue between Sycamore and Laurel Streets.

The above street segments will also be rehabilitated in the upcoming weeks. Replacement of two alleyway driveways between South Shasta and South Butte Streets at the entrances of West Laurel and West Ash Streets is also underway. All construction is expected to be completed by mid-June.



Planning Division

La Calle Food Truck

The proposed project includes using a vacant lot to install a food trailer, employ twofull-time employees, and open from 11:00 am to 6:00 pm daily. The applicant plans to install a restroom, landscaping, and to connect to public sewer, water, and electricity. On April 25, 2024, the Planning Commission conditionally approved the La Calle Food Truck project contingent upon review and acceptance of detailed plans. The project will return to the Planning Commission for further consideration when detailed site plans are submitted.

10.05.150 Vision Obstructions by Trees, etc. - Whenever the traffic authority finds that any hedge, shrubbery or tree growing in a parkway or otherwise adjacent to a city street obstructs the view of any intersection, or any traffic upon the streets approaching such intersection, said traffic authority shall cause the hedge, shrubbery or tree to be immediately removed or reduced in height or width so as to effectively remove the obstruction. [Ord. 383 § 3, 11-21-60. Prior code § 16-15].



FINANCE

Sales Tax Revenue Trends and Quarterly Report

HdL, the company that monitors the City's sales tax revenue, recently published Willows' October - December 2023 quarterly sales tax report. The report includes valuable insight as to how much sales tax revenue the city is generating and where it is coming from. Additionally, HdL also released another interesting report covering sales tax trends and economic drivers for the state of California.

Tyler Technologies Transition

After losing the City's entire two-employee Finance Department to abrupt voluntary departures in late August 2023, there have been many delays and it has taken considerable time to get back on schedule with Tyler Technologies to complete the transition of the City's remaining software modules, including business licenses, permitting, code enforcement, and recreation. That said, the City is back on Tyler's calendar and moving forward to transition to all of the Tyler Technologies modules. Anticipated completion is by the fall of 2024.

Fire Response, Prevention & Emergency Medical Services

2024 Weed Abatement & Hazardous Fuels Reduction Program

As of April 15, the City's Weed Abatement Program is underway!



For more than 40 years, the Weed Abatement

Program has been a critical component of the City's fire prevention strategy. The City's extremely low Insurance Services Office (ISO) rating has ensured that Willows' residents benefit from lower homeowner insurance costs.

Due to limited Fire Department staffing levels, it is imperative that the department focuses on wildfire prevention in an effort to safeguard the lives and property of the citizens and visitors of Willows. For fiscal years 2023, 2024 and 2024, CAL FIRE has

100% funded the City's Weed Abatement Program also known as, the Hazardous Fuels Reduction Program.

For best practice, please follow the adopted abatement standards:

Land areas of one acre or more:

- A cleared space around all buildings 30' wide minimum,
- A cleared space (e.g., fire break) 10' wide complete around perimeter of property and 10' wide cross breaks every 30', and
- A cleared space extending 15' beyond foliage of any group of trees.

Land areas of less than one acre:

• Complete abatement is required. All weeds, grass or other growth that could be expected to burn when dry MUST be removed or otherwise abated from the entire parcel of property whereby growth attains a height not exceeding 4 inches.

Surveys of the City will be conducted the week of April 15, May 22 and June 1. All property owners must have fire hazards abated prior to May 31, 2024. Properties that still pose a hazard to the community after the May 31 deadline will be abated by the City of Willows contractor at the property owners expense. The goal of this program is 100% voluntary compliance.

If you receive a notice, and your property has already been abated of weeds, rubbish or other potential fire hazard conditions and will be maintained, please accept our gratitude for helping to make our community a safer and healthier place to live.

<u>Please note, there is up to a two-week delay from the time the survey is completed</u> <u>and the property owner is notified of the abatement via mail.</u>

Major Incidents

Willows Fire Department (WFD) responded to a structure Fire at County Road 46 and County Road SS. Units arrived to a fully engulfed detached garage that was beginning to spread to the main home. Units were able to mitigate the threat to the main house; however, the detached garage was a complete loss. No injuries were reported.

Public Events

April was National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week! Generally, though, we refer to them as Dispatchers. This year, the WFD is especially grateful to the Dispatchers of the Glenn County Sheriff's Office (GCSO) because the WFD, along with all the other Fire Departments and Districts in Glenn County, are now part of consolidated dispatch by the GCSO. The transfer of dispatch services to



the GCSO has resulted in faster response times, better communication, and most of all greater camaraderie with law enforcement and surrounding fire protection districts.

9-1-1 Dispatchers frequently assist callers on the worst day of their lives. They manage emergency logistics of dynamic incidents and coordinate with all responders and the community seeking emergency assistance. We couldn't do it without you. Thank you so much to all GCSO Dispatchers as well as past Dispatchers. Willows Fire appreciates every single one of you!


VFW Award of Appreciation


Upcoming Summer Events






Library Activity April 2024




